#### One West Lancs Forum and Showcase

Over 150 people from 68 public, private and voluntary sector organisations attended the **third One West Lancs Forum and Showcase event** on July 6th 2016 at Edge Hill University.

The Forum provides input into key West Lancs issues and is an arena where information about West Lancashire developments can be shared and discussed.

# Queen's Award for Voluntary Service winners

Congratulations to two North West groups who have been awarded the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service - the highest award a voluntary group can receive in the UK and the equivalent of the MBE.

**Skem Men-Aces** is a football team for adults with learning disabilities based in Skelmersdale. Since forming in July 2009 the club has grown to over 40 members and its popularity goes from strength to strength.



**North West Blood Bikes** work in the community to provide a free, out of hours service delivering life saving items between NHS hospitals - including urgent and emergency blood, platelets, samples, donor breast milk, patient notes, theatre equipment, in fact anything that can be carried by motorcycle.

Formed in May 2012 the charity completes over 800 runs per month. The service is provided through the night, at weekends and on Bank Holiday including Christmas and New Year. The service is run by almost 300 volunteers with varying roles - including riders, call controllers and fundraisers.

## **Getting Active in West Lancs**

A good example of what 'getting active' means was given by a group of visually impaired cricketers from the Galloways Society for the Blind, when they attended the One West Lancs Forum in July. They played a short exhibition cricket game on the field inside the Edge Hill running track and demonstrated that having a disability is no barrier to people enjoying sport.

The group currently trains and play their matches at Mawdesley Cricket Club, which is one of three disability focus cricket clubs set up by the Lancashire Cricket Board in Lancashire last year. The Community Food Growing Project is funded by Lancashire County Council as part of the Active West Lancs programme.

# Lancashire Young Apprenticeship Ambassador Network (LYAAN)

Forty Four young people have signed up to an initiative to promote apprenticeships across Lancashire.

The Lancashire Young Apprenticeship Ambassador Network (LYAAN) is part of a county-wide drive to increase training and employment opportunities for young people and improve skills.

The apprenticeship ambassadors are all either current apprentices or former apprentices who want to highlight the benefits of taking part in the Apprenticeship programme to employers and other young people. They will speak about their experiences at schools, youth clubs and careers fairs and meet employers face to face to encourage them to take on Apprentices.

The network is a joint initiative set up by the Lancashire Skills and Employment Hub, which is part of the Lancashire Enterprise Partnership (LEP), and the Lancashire Work Based Learning Executive Forum, a consortium of Lancashire apprenticeship providers.
